RECORD KEEPING/ INCOME TAX

The Seven Rules of Good Record Keeping

- 1. Track income from each parent, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, and Dept. of Social Services. Any other business income. Give parents receipts, have Parents sign them.
- 2. Save the receipts for all business purchases. Personal receipts too, if it is part business use deductible.
- 3. Mark your receipts. Use abbreviations. Mark business category.
- 4. Organize receipts by category, not by month. At end of month after all receipts are recorded then you can put them in one envelope for that month.
- 5. Keep track of how much time each week you use your home for business.
 This includes extra time on paperwork, planning act., meals, calls, and interviews.
- 6. Conduct a regular review of your records.
- 7. Send in Estimated Tax payments quarterly- approx. 20% of estimated net profit. (15.3%-Soc.Sec.& 10-15% income tax)
- 8. After filing your tax return, keep your records in a safe place for five years.

IRS Form SS-4- Application for Employer Identification Number- I encourage all providers to apply and use one. With identity theft on the rise, it is better to use this number than your social security number.

- Question 9- Other- write in Privacy
- Question 14- Other- write in Family Child Care

IRS Form SE- SELF EMPLOYMENT TAX- You are not getting taxed because you are self employed. This amount is actually what you are paying into your Social Security Account for that year.

IRS Form W-10- DEPENDANT CARE PROVIDER'S IDENTIFICATION & CERT.

Give to parents at end of year with total amount paid for the year.

You can make a copy and use it as your end of year receipt.

Microsoft Works, MS Money, Quicken, Peachtree

- Microsoft Works- use Financial Worksheets- monthly home budget/personal budget. Customize to business budget- three areas needed, Income, Expenses, and monthly Totals.
- Use invoice statements for each parent to keep track of payments and amounts owed
- Use contacts section for daycare children's information and records.
- Can create own spreadsheets and/or scan in copies of CACFP forms and attendance sheets, etc.
