OCFS UPDATES ALLERGY POSTING RULES

In February 14, 2023, DCCS sent a Dear Provider letter regarding revisions made to two health forms: the OCFS-LDSS-7006 and the Health Care Plans. The 7006 Individual Health Care Plan (IHCP) for a Child with Special Health Care Needs has been updated to include language that allows a parent to provide written consent to the child care program to share their child's allergy information with caregivers in a non-discreet way. Non-discreet strategies may include visual reminders and other cues to help caregivers be more be more aware of allergies. This may include using placemats at mealtimes that illustrate a child's allergens or using a specific color cup/plate/ utensil. You may consider hanging signage on the classroom door as a visual reminder to staff that a child(ren) with a diagnosed allergy is enrolled. Before using non-discreet strategies, the program MUST obtain written consent from the child's parent. When caring for a child with a diagnosed allergy, the program must ensure all caregivers are educated about the child's individual health needs. As a reminder, individual health care plans' anaphylaxis policies must be reviewed at least annually or more frequently as needed so all staff are aware of how to prevent exposure and how to respond in the event of an emergency.
